On October 5, 2012 at the Annual General Meeting of the TTAO a new Executive was elected (see list below). Did you Know?

One of the world's most famous costume artists is **Peter Minshall**, otherwise known as 'Mas Man', who grew up in Port-of-Spain.





At an early age Minshall was exposed to Carnival and made his first costume at thirteen. After graduating from Queen's Royal College, he left Trinidad to study Theatre Design at the Central School of Art and Design in London and went on to receive unanimous critical praise for his professional theatre design work both in England and the United States.

In 1974 he created his seminal individual work From the Land of the Hummingbird for the Trinidad Carnival. Then, in 1976 he designed "Paradise Lost" for Stephen Lee Heung, which won the Band of the Year title. On his own, he started with a band called Zodiac that achieved broad critical acclaim in 1979 when its "Carnival of the Sea", won in all the categories.

Minshall has presented a mas' at each Carnival from 1978 through 1990, and again in 1993, 1994, and 1995, costuming some two thousand people in anywhere from thirty to one hundred different designs. He makes the streets of Port-of-Spain his stage during Carnival with unique designs that feature "dancing mobiles." He claims that mas--"living art that we make fresh every year"--is the truest artistic expression of Trinidad. "Our aesthetic is performance, the living now." A major aim of his life's work has been to prove that mas can be "high" art, as capable of the sublime or the universal as any other art form.

In addition to designing mas, Minshall has worked on a variety of performance projects. In 1985, he led Adoration of Hiroshima, a nuclear protest mas', in Washington D.C. He helped design the opening awards ceremonies for the 1987 Pan American Games, the 1992 Barcelona Olympics, the 1996 Atlanta Olympics, the 1994 Football World Cup and the 2002 Salt Lake City Winter Olympics. He also collaborated with Jean Michel Jarre, once in 1990 on Paris la Defense, and again in 1995 on the Concert For Tolerance. Minshall's creations have also been on display and at the opening ceremony of the ICC Cricket World Cup 2007.




Near Open Water: Stories by Keith Jardim
