In Memory of.....



The Trinidad & Tobago Association of Ottawa lost yet another one of its members with the passing of **Dr. Rudolph Ormsby Gittens** on September 18, 2013.

Dr. Gittens, a legendary sports medicine physician, was well known in Ottawa for his work with the Ottawa Rough Riders. He served as the team doctor

for more than 20 years. He also worked in the same capacity with the Ottawa 67s. In 1984 Dr. Gittens took on a similar role with Canada's national soccer teams.

Internationally, Dr. Gittens served on sports medical committees, including committees for the Atlanta 1996 Olympic Football Tournament, the FIFA Women's World Cup USA 1999 and three successive FIFA World Cups from 1998. In 2007, he was the general medical officer for the FIFA U-20 World Cup Canada, which was held in six cities across Canada including Ottawa.

He was inducted into the Soccer Hall of Fame in 2007, after being part of the Canadian teams that won CONCACAF championships in 1985 and 2000. He was also a member of the CONCACAF Hall of Fame and worked as a volunteer leading the Canadian Soccer Association Medical Committee for more than 20 years.

He obtained pharmaceutical and medical degrees from the University of Saskatchewan before earning a fellow in orthopaedics from the University of Ottawa.

Rudy Gittens was a man of integrity, respect and compassion. His brilliant mind, infectious humour and warm, caring manner left a lasting impact on all who came into contact with him. We extend our sincere condolences to Dr. Gittens' family and loved ones.

Did you Know ...?

Some interesting Trinidad and Tobago facts...

1. Trinidad and Tobago Carnival has been consistently ranked as one of the top ten Carnival celebrations in the world. It is popularly known as 'The Greatest Show on Earth'. Claudia Jones, the founder of the Notting Hill Carnival, Europe's largest street festival, hails from Trinidad and Tobago.

2. The limbo dance originated as an event that took place at wakes in Trinidad and Tobago, but became internationally renowned through the work of Julia Edwards and her dance company in the 1960s.

3. Trinidad and Tobago's Dr. Joseph Lennox Pawan achieved international acclaim for the discovery of the transmission of the rabies virus by vampire bats. This led to the development of a vaccine for the virus.

4. Trinidad and Tobago's Brian Charles Lara holds the record for the highest individual score in a test innings (400 not out against England, Antigua 2004). He is also the only batsman to have ever scored a hundred, a double century, a triple century, a quadruple century and a quintuple century in first class games over the course of a senior career.

5. The Trinidadian accent ranks 10th on the CNN's top ten sexiest accents in the world.


