### Trini Youngsters Win Global Scientific/Engineering Award

NorthGate wins global Cubes in Space award

You wouldn't normally expect to hear a conversation about "ionisation" in the earth's atmosphere" happening between a group of 12 - 14-year-old youngsters. But that conversation is exactly what led enterprising youth from this country to the top prize in the Cubes In Space global contest.

Seven pupils from NorthGate College, captured the 2014 Cubes In Space MPAC Group Top Design Award, for a science experiment that will be launched into space on June 26, a statement from NorthGate said.

One member of the team, Deron Khelawan, 13, explained, "The Ionisation Investigation seeks to measure the extent to which an electromagnetic field is generated as the payload moves through the ionosphere."

The Cubes In Space programme is a partnership between Rubik Learning Initiative, idoodlesoftwareinc., the Colorado Space Grant Consortium's RockSat-C programme

### C.L.R. JAMES SCHOLARSHIP AWARD CRITERIA

### 1. **Purpose**

To encourage and reward members of the association and their families who pursue their educational goals at college or university.

### 2. Number and Value of Award(s)

Two scholarships will be awarded in 2014 in the amount of \$700 each. The scholarship will not be automatically renewable.

Each scholarship may be used for a full-time course of study which leads to a first degree or diploma.

### 3. Where Tenable

The awards are tenable at any accredited university, college or educational institution.

### 4. Eligibility

- a) Good standing members of the association, their spouses, children or children of deceased members are eligible for the awards. For the purpose of scholarship eligibility, children include a members:
  - own children
  - nieces, nephews, grandchildren and stepchildren who are:
    - solely dependent on members for support and maintenance and/or living with the member in a parent/child relationship

**NOTE**: "Members" should be in proper financial status and in good standing with the association as at the closing date for the receipt of applications.

- b) Applicants will normally be expected to provide confirmation of admission to a post-secondary institution, in accordance with #3 above.
- c) Applicants must normally be prepared to commence or continue their higher education studies in the calendar year in which the award is presented.
- d) Applicants who are continuing students must provide proof of successful completion of their previous academic year.

### 5. Selection of Scholarship Winners

The scholarship program will be administered by the Education Committee of the Trinidad and Tobago Association of Ottawa.

Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of scholastic ability, character, leadership qualities and involvement in school and/or community activities. All applicants will be notified in writing of the results of the selection process.

### 6. **Obligation of Winners**

- a) Award winners are expected to use the scholarship funds for educational purposes, as intended.
- b) Award winners are expected to advise the association of their achievements at the end of the academic year by providing transcripts and other relevant documents.

### 7. Method of Payment

Payment of scholarships will be made by the association either to the institution to be attended or to the recipient, as agreed upon by the successful applicant and the association.

### 8. Method of Application

### 9. **Receipt of Application and Closing Date**

If mailed, the postmark on the envelope must be August 29, 2014 or earlier. Emails must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. on August 29, 2014.
