- pay a minimum annual contribution.

two, not even three but 17 universities.

At just seven years old Dylan Chidick, along with his mother and younger twin brothers, left their home in Point Fortin in hopes of a brighter future in the United States.

However, not long after settling in New Jersey the family began falling on hard times. During a Skype interview with Guardian Media Limited Dylan explained how challenging life had become "my family went through a lot, many would look at me and say that I won't achieve my goals". The family's situation would then take a sharp turn for the worse when Dylan's younger brothers were diagnosed with serious heart conditions.

Mounting medical bills subsequently forced the family into periods of homelessness. Dylan described the family's new struggle as scary "we lived among disabled people, and others suffering from various illnesses, we had to adapt and were forced to comply with certain conditions, it was difficult for us all but I tried not to show how it affected me."

Despite the insurmountable obstacles Dylan and his family faced, he never forgot his dream to achieve. Instead of hanging his head, the Jersey City student began shouldering some of the load which was weighing his family down heavily. "When we lived in the shelter I took advanced school so that the next year which is now I would be able to leave school early. I would get up by 6.30, leave the house by 7.30 then take the train and drop my brothers to summer camp, from there I'd go to school from 8.30 to 12.30 and then from 1 to 7 pm I will work at the recreation centre. I worked at the pool as a locker room attendant and I basically clean up after people and after that, I'd go home and do my homework."

Dylan rose to become senior class president at Henry Snyder High School, now the 17-year-old son of the soil has gotten acceptance letters from 17 of the 18 universities he applied to.

From a homeless teen enduring financial struggles with his family, Dylan is now proof that through determination and hard work you can accomplish all your goals.

He intends to visit home later this year, but in the meantime, he wants students who may have their backs against the wall to "push through and don't let your dream out of sight, keep working until you've accomplished your goals."

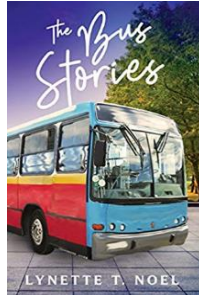

The Bus Stories is a compilation of the unique and varied experiences that the author shares about her trips using her country's public transport. Uncertain travels set the stage for the series of unexpected events that are chronicled in The Bus Stories. These stories meander along a pathway that is shaped by the actions and attitudes of the characters depicted in them. To Greet or Not and The Anatomy of Good Morning invite the reader to re-examine some societal norms that persons take for granted. As the reader journeys on, he or she is introduced to Saved by the Bus and encounters another character Living off the foolish/Making a Living - a common sight in any busy thoroughfare. The reader gets glimpses into the cultural realities of the author's world and how these are displayed in That is how we is! and This seat could be mine. Though some of those realities may seem harsh, the author reminds us that even in our busyness, we can still find time to care for others and notice our fellow travellers. No passenger left back and Crossing one's path reinforce that idea. Before The Bus Stories can be completed, the reader is treated to another exciting experience aptly called, Too hot for the journey. As the meandering lessens and the road ahead is more visible, we are presented with hope- an adolescent's declaration that The best man is an honest man.

Having given you the opportunity to explore the vagaries of using public transport daily, the author encourages you to join her as she reflects Going Beyond the Book. A Bill recognising The Double Chaconia as Trinidad and Tobago's national flower was passed in the Senate on May 7, 2019. The National Emblems of TT (Regulation) (Amendment) Bill was passed with the support of both the Opposition and Independent benches.

The previous national flower was The Chaconia, also known as Wild Poinsettia or Pride of Trinidad and Tobago.

Tobago Fun Facts:

Tobago's first British capital was named Georgetown and was located further along the windward coastline of Tobago, near Studley Park.

Fort Granby is the second oldest fort on the island. It was built in 1765 to protect Tobago's first capital, Georgetown.

The Tobago West Main Ridge Forest Reserve is the oldest of its kind in the Western Hemisphere. On April 13th, 1776, Governor Sir William Young signed an ordinance making this unique attraction the first ecological Rain Forest Reserve.
